Current activity

- o Working with other NZPsS members to ensure that conference sessions are relevant to the work of educational and developmental psychologists.
- o Encouraging educational and developmental psychologists to present their research and practice reports at the 2007 conference.
- o Supporting members to conduct quality research and to publish articles concerned with the practice of educational/developmental psychology.

Full Membership (Academic)

- Currently working in the tertiary education sector and primarily involved in teaching or research activities related to the field of educational, child or developmental psychology.
- Have post-graduate qualifications in educational, child or developmental psychology.

Full Membership (Practitioner)

- Have demonstrated academic training and competency in core subjects at a post-graduate level including (e.g., by holding a PG Dip in Educational Psychology): - human development - educational psychology - applied behaviour analysis - psychological assessment - psychological research - counseling.
- Be NZ Registered

(Provisional Membership - May be granted to Full Member applicants until such time as they have satisfied the Institute that they meet the criteria for Full Membership.)

Associate Membership - Associate Membership may be granted to any person who is working in a related field and has an interest in educational or developmental psychology but who does not meet the registration and academic criteria referred to above.
