

Gwenda M. Willis, PhD, is a Registered Clinical Psychologist and Associate Professor of clinical psychology at the University of Auckland. Gwen's research and clinical work focus on strengths-based approaches to working with people who have sexually abused or at risk to abuse. She provides training and consultation to clinicians internationally, including in the application of the contemporary Good Live Model of rehabilitation and Trauma-Informed Care. Gwen has received numerous grants and accolades for her research, which has been widely cited. In 2015 she was awarded a 5-year Royal Society Rutherford Discovery Fellowship to research protective factors against sexual reoffending. Gwen is a Fellow of the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ATSA), a member of the ATSA prevention committee, Editorial Board member for *Sexual Abuse* and *Journal of Sexual Aggression*, and an avid advocate for preventing sexual abuse.
