- Maintaining effective relationships with Oranga Tamariki site managers, regional manager and other staff
- Developing and maintain effective liaison and consultation with Police and Health child abuse specialists and their respective management teams
- Developing the knowledge base for Clinical Services practice including psychological/forensic/therapeutic assessment, interviews, consultations and interventions
- Developing, building and fostering relationships with Iwi, Māori and Pacific Peoples and other client groups within service delivery contexts to ensure services are proactive, timely and appropriate
