Where you'll be working: Waikato Hospital – Child Development Centre (CDC) The details: There are opportunities for permanent or fixed term and full time or part time roles to work as a psychologist in the CDC

Are you passionate about tamariki with developmental disabilities and looking to make a positive difference in the lives of tamariki and their whanau?

About the role:

You will be working in a multidisciplinary team within the Child Development Centre (CDC). The CDC provides multi-disciplinary assessment and intervention for tamariki aged 0 - 19 years with developmental disabilities. The psychologists within CDC carry out diagnostic assessments with children and young adolescents with developmental disabilities.

The position would ideally suit a psychologist with experience in the assessment of Autism Spectrum Disorder, Intellectual Disability and other common neurodevelopmental conditions. Proficiency in the administration and interpretation of psychometric instruments, in particular the WISC-V and the ADOS-2 would be an advantage. Excellent written communication skills are required as assessment report writing is a key part of the role.

Required skills & experience:

- registration with the NZ Psychologists Board
- hold a valid annual practicing certificate
- hold a post graduate qualification in clinical, educational, child and adolescent or health psychology
- a full New Zealand licence and the ability to travel
