Whilst doing this you will support students from diverse backgrounds to meet the competencies required to register with the New Zealand Psychologists Board in the Clinical Scope of Practice. You will also supervise research students towards honours and doctoral degrees. You will undertake original research and secure research funding in your area of specialisation.
