Workshop Description

This workshop introduces the 335-item MMPI-3, the most recent version of the MMPI instruments, for use in psychological practice.

The first part covers introductory materials and will touch on the history of the MMPI instruments, rationale for the current version, and understanding the nature of the new normative sample. There will be an overview of the MMPI-3 scales and basic psychometrics and research. The appropriateness for using the MMPI-3 in Aotearoa will also be discussed. The basic foundations of administration, scoring, and interpretation will be described.

The second part of the workshop will focus on MMPI-3 applications in the areas of civil litigation, and in particular, personal injury/disability and family court evaluations. Case illustrations from civil forensic settings will be included.

Professor Martin Sellbom

Martin Sellbom is a Professor in Clinical Psychology at the University of Otago in Dunedin, New Zealand. He received his PhD in Clinical Psychology in 2007 from Kent State University (USA). His research focuses on psychopathy and other personality disorders, contemporary models of psychopathology and mental health, and personality assessment with the MMPI instruments.

Professor Sellbom's work has been featured in over 300 publications and he has co-authored a book on Interpreting the MMPI-3 (with Y.S. Ben-Porath) and on Forensic Mental Health Assessments with the MMPI-3 (with D.B. Wygant; currently in

press). He has won several awards, including the American Psychological Foundation's Theodore Millon mid-career award for advancing personality science, Society for Personality Assessment's Mid-Career Award, and the American Psychology-Law Society's Saleem Shah Award for early career achievement.

Professor Sellbom currently serves as the Editor-in-Chief for the Journal of Personality Assessment. For his clinical practice, he specialises in forensic psychological evaluations.
